Rural Americans face persistent poverty.

Poverty rates in rural towns are 27% higher than in urban areas, and 80% of U.S. counties with long-term poverty are in rural America.

But few philanthropic dollars reach rural areas.

Despite the clear need, few guaranteed income programs have been designed specifically to support rural communities.

We're aiming to fill this gap.

With support from Jeff Atwood and Elizabeth Burton, we're sending \$1,500/month, no-strings-attached, for 16 months to roughly 1,800 people across rural WV, NC, and a third region to come.

Cash can unlock the American Dream for these families.

Dozens of U.S.-based studies show that no-strings-attached cash supports people to take steps towards a more prosperous future.

Reliably get to work and invest in their homes. Families can fix their cars and improve their living conditions.

Handle surprise bills without panic. From medical bills to child care, families won't have to choose between essentials.



Feel less stressed and more in control. With basics covered, people can plan ahead instead of living day-to-day.
